THE GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION 2018 (GDPR) NOTICE

BSPA will not disclose any personal data to third party data controllers other than in accordance with EU/DEFRA passport legislation, unless in accordance with legal obligations or with your written permission.

BSPA will continue to process your personal data as part of its ongoing Horse and Studbook (breeding) database, unless and until you notify BSPA in writing to stop processing your personal data.

Information supplied concerning your Ownership details, Passport or horse registration will be passed by BSPA to DEFRA and/or the Central Equine Database (CED) as is required by Horse Passport Regulations to provide a source of data that supports veterinary disease control and surveillance activities.

AND

- the discharge of its responsibilities for implementation of horse passports;
- to facilitate strategic planning within the equine sector;
- to assist in tracing the owners of straying, lost or stolen horses; and
- to reduce malpractice in the sale of horses and ponies.

In certain, limited circumstances, DEFRA or its agents may be required to release information, including personal data upon request, under the Environmental Information Regulations, the Code of Practice on Access to Government Information or the Freedom of Information Act 2000, However, neither DEFRA nor its agents will permit any unwarranted breach of confidentiality nor will BSPA act in contravention of its obligations under the General Data Protection Regulation 2018 (GDPR).

Unless you indicate otherwise to DEFRA or its appointed agents, they may use your name, address and other details on your application form to contact you regarding occasional customer research, aimed at improving the services that they provide.
